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INTRODUCTION

This booklet has been prepared to provide you with relevant information about the choices available to you in Year 11 for your Key Stage 5 studies and how to set about making such choices.

Year 11 marks the end of compulsory school education. At this stage, you have a choice about what you would like to do next. Opportunities include continuing to study at Cantonian, studying at a different educational institution such as college, or entering employment or an apprenticeship scheme. Whatever you decide, you will receive support from the school to prepare you for your next phase.

If you choose to continue your studies at Cantonian, you will be in an environment of excellent teaching and support. The size of the school Sixth Form ensures that all your teachers know you and are able to support you to achieve the best outcomes that you are capable of.

In Key Stage 5, you select which subjects you would like to study. When making choices, it is important to consider how these may affect your future options in terms of careers and educational opportunities such as University. Your parents/ quardians will have the opportunity to speak to staff in relation to any choices being considered.

It is important that you think through the implications of your choices. In particular, the following are important considerations:

- An option takes up approximately 1/3 of your timetable. Pupils work better in subjects that they enjoy.
- Opting for a subject requires a twovear commitment.

I would recommend talking to your teachers to get more information if you are considering choosing their subjects.

All pupils are expected to follow the Welsh Baccalaureate qualification in both Years 12 and 13.

WHY WOULD YOU STUDY THIS **QUALIFICATION?**

Studying Art and Design provides entry to an unprecedented range of specialisms, skills – both traditional and digital – and careers. Art and Design (Art, Craft and Design) is designed to promote learning across a variety of experiences and through various processes, tools, techniques, materials and resources to generate different kinds of evidence of working and outcomes.

- Unit 3 (A2): Externally Assessed Assignment (based on preparatory study which is 24% of the qualification)

WHY WOULD YOU STUDY THIS **QUALIFICATION?**

Biology is the study of life. It will enable you to develop a vast array of skills and acquire knowledge about the natural world and all the living things within it. Gaining an A Level in this subject opens up a vast range of opportunities for both university degrees and career options.

WHAT SKILLS WILL YOU GAIN FROM THIS OUALIFICATION?

Studying A Level Biology will enable you to develop:

- an understanding of different areas of biology and how they relate to each other;
- competency in a variety of investigative and practical techniques, including using a microscope, recording quantitative measurements in a variety of contexts, microbiology, fieldwork and dissection;

A LEVEL CHEMISTRY

WHY WOULD YOU STUDY THIS **QUALIFICATION?**

Chemistry is the study of all chemical substances and how to change one chemical into another. The food you eat, the air you breathe, your own body, your mobile phone, the plants and streets around you are all made of chemicals. As we want inexpensive products, chemistry helps to decrease economic costs and as we want a safe environment, chemistry helps to decrease pollution by detecting the toxins and by destroying them. Studying AS/A2 Chemistry provides the next step in understanding the interactions between materials. Most topic areas, such as atomic structure, bonding, the Periodic Table, energy, rates of reaction and organic chemistry will be familiar from GCSE, but explored in greater detail throughout the course.

WHAT SKILLS WILL YOU GAIN FROM THIS QUALIFICATION?

Studying A Level Chemistry will enable you to:

- develop essential knowledge and understanding of different areas of the subject and how they relate to each other:
- develop and demonstrate a deep appreciation of the skills, knowledge and understanding of scientific methods:

- develop your interest in and enthusiasm for the subject, including developing an interest in further study and careers associated with the subject; and
- understand how society makes decisions about scientific issues and how the sciences contribute to the success of the economy and society.

WHY WOULD YOU STUDY THIS **QUALIFICATION?**

Studying Computer Science, gives you an in-depth understanding of the fundamental concepts of computer science and a broad scope of study opportunities. Computers are widely used in all aspects of business, industry, government, education, leisure and the home. In this increasingly technological age, a study of computer science, and particularly how computers are used in the solution of a variety of problems, is not only valuable to you but also essential to the future wellbeing of the country. Computer science demands both logical discipline and imaginative creativity in the selection and design of algorithms and the writing, testing, and debugging of programs. It relies on an understanding of the rules of language at a fundamental level.

WHY WOULD YOU STUDY THIS **OUALIFICATION?**

Studying English Language and Literature promotes the integrated study of English language and English literature. It enables you to develop intellectual maturity through exploring a range of literary and non-literary texts, including the WJEC English Language and Literature Poetry Pre-1914 Anthology. Through their reading, you will be able to develop the skills required to interrogate texts, be critically reflective, consider other viewpoints, be independent, make connections across a range of texts and to understand and evaluate the effects of a variety of contexts. This qualification also gives you opportunities to deepen your enjoyment of English language and literature both through reading and through creating your own texts. Fundamental to the course as a whole, you will demonstrate knowledge and understanding of how to apply linguistic and literary methodologies and concepts to inform your responses to and interpretations of text.

WHAT SKILLS WILL YOU GAIN FROM THIS QUALIFICATION?

Studying A Level English Language and Literature encourages you to develop your interest and enjoyment of English as you:

- develop and apply your knowledge of literary analysis and evaluation;
- develop and apply your understanding of the concepts and methods appropriate for the analysis and study of language;
- use linguistic and literary approaches in your reading and interpretation of texts, showing how the two disciplines can relate to each other;





- A pupil chooses a course which is not suited to their academic ability.
- A subject may conflict with other choices the pupil has made.
- There are health & safety risks

The 'free choice' exercise will be used to decide course viability and create the option grids to maximise pupil choice. Any courses removed will be communicated to pupils.





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
