This culture is embedded throughout the school and ensures that our pupils are well motivated and ready to learn, responsible for their own actions, and respectful of the whole school community and its surroundings.



transition

Cantonian has excellent links with our partner primary schools. To support the transition process, our Cluster of schools meet on a regular basis to discuss and develop curriculum plans and to improve our shared understanding of progression. Cluster meetings help us to strengthen connections and allow staff across the different schools to work effectively together, sharing ideas, examples of good practice and effective teaching strategies.

We offer a range of activities for all Year 6 pupils, including morning sessions with each individual primary school and two full days of transition activities where pupils have the opportunity to experience life at Cantonian. These are all designed to help pupils get to know us and make the move to high school as smooth as possible.

For more vulnerable pupils, we host additional 'Pathfinders' visits where pupils and their parents/carers are invited to join us for a morning or afternoon of wellbeing sessions.

To complete the registration process, key members of staff hold one-to-one meetings with parents/carers, which also give us the opportunity to find out more information about their child's background, interests and hobbies, and any other information which would be helpful in settling them into Cantonian.

The transition to high school can be a worrying time for parents/carers, but our tried and tested process ensures it is as comfortable as possible for all concerned.















curriculum

Cantonian is excited to embrace the new Curriculum for Wales. This has been designed to enthuse pupils aged 3 to 16 and give them the foundations they need to succeed in an ever-changing world.

The Curriculum for Wales has more emphasis on equipping young people for life. Its key objective is to ensure that schools support young people in achieving four purposes, and our own curriculum has been designed to inspire this.

The four purposes aim to make pupils:

- ambitious, capable learners, ready to learn throughout their lives
- enterprising, creative contributors, ready to play a full part in life and work
- ethical, informed citizens of Wales and the world
- healthy, confident individuals, ready to lead fulfilling lives as valued members of society

The Curriculum for Wales is organised into the following six Areas of Learning & Experience (AOLEs), which link subjects together to promote collaboration and support pupils in working towards the four purposes:

- Expressive Arts
- Health & Wellbeing
- Languages, Literacy & Communication
- Mathematics & Numeracy
- Humanities
- Science & Technology






Cantonian has worked together across our own AOLEs and with other schools to build a curriculum that ensures 'The best from each. success for all'

Cantonian Craft

At Cantonian, we have a culture of exceptional teaching, known as the 'Cantonian Craft'. Lessons include the following specific teaching strategies to support pupils' learning:

Challenge There is a culture of challenge where pupils develop their thinking and problem-solving skills to understand how to overcome difficulty and build resilience.

Explanation and Modelling There is a culture of clear and direct instruction where key knowledge is made explicit, understandable and memorable.

All pupils are given the skills and opportunities to maximise their potential, ensuing that standards of achievement are excellent.

These outcomes are driven via the setting of aspirational targets and having high expectations of all our pupils who themselves, are ambitious, confident, creative and inquisitive learners who are motivated and ready to learn.

Questioning

There is a culture of inquiry where both teachers and pupils ask questions about learning.

Deliberate Practice and Reviews

There is a culture of 'deliberate practice' where pupils have the opportunity to practice what they have learnt, develop independent thinking and produce high-quality independent work which is reviewed throughout the

There is a culture of feedback where both teachers and pupils are able to give high-quality points for improvement.

Pupils with additional learning needs and those identified as more able and talented are supported throughout the curriculum by all our staff. This ensures they make progress relative to their starting point.



an inclusive school

We are committed to ensuring all our pupils develop as successful individuals, from our most vulnerable pupils to our more able and talented learners. As a school, we recognise that for pupils to achieve their potential, their learning must be personalised to meet their individual needs.

We also recognise that learning is more than academic achievement, and should be centred on the development of the whole child, including their personal development. Ultimately, the school strives to be a centre where learning is valued and pupils achieve their potential in a happy and safe community where they show respect and tolerance for others.

The school offers a range of support for pupils with Additional Learning Needs and where possible, all our pupils with additional needs are integrated into mainstream lessons.

Learners make progress when they feel valued, safe and secure and this is the environment we strive to achieve for ALL learners at Cantonian.

wellbeing

At Cantonian, we promote an inclusive environment to ensure 'The best from each, success for all'. We believe that a happy pupil is a successful one and are committed to providing a positive, safe, and stimulating environment for pupils to learn and where they feel valued.

Central to our curriculum vision is wellbeing which is the driving ambition to develop pupils' resilience and self-worth which in turn will enable them to thrive, progress and succeed in school and in life.

There is clear evidence that positive wellbeing, a healthy lifestyle and engagement in school are key factors in academic and social achievement and can subsequently improve a pupil's chances in later life.

Pupils are encouraged to further develop their abilities and social skills by taking part in as many activities as possible, available through the curriculum and as part of our extracurricular programme.

We offer a large number of clubs and activiities that pupils can take part in, both within and outside the school day, including academic clubs, sporting activities and a daily breakfast club open to all pupils.

We also have our wellbeing dog, 'Lottie' who provides outstanding support and a positive impact daily to our pupils and staff.





our community

The contribution of our pupils is key to ensuring that Cantonian is a caring and vibrant community hub.

We have an active School Council, responsible for representing pupils' views and raising any issues with senior staff and governors. They actively participate in the local community, including the weekly Walk & Talk Club, litter picking and helping in local care homes.

We have great links with our partner primary schools and regularly participate in joint events throughout the year, including the annual Christmas Carol Service in Llandaff Cathedral.

We are also part of the Fairwater Youth Action Group (YAG), which includes representatives from businesses, local government, the police, other schools and the wider community. The group provides a holistic approach to dealing with any issues raised and has a passion and enthusiasm for working together to support and engage our young people, for the benefit of the whole community. As a result of the work of the group, Cantonian now hosts a Youth Club, supported by Cardiff Youth Services.

We also host an annual Parent & Child Cooking Club, which gives pupils and their parents/carers the opportunity to cook a meal together to take home. This year's theme was Welsh recipes.

Christmas Cards designed by our very talented pupils are delivered to the local community each December. This has become a festive tradition and we hope our neighbours look forward to receiving them.

Cantonian is a proud supporter of Insole Court & Gardens and pupils and staff join the annual sponsored 'Glo Aur Walk' from Cymer (Rhondda) to Insole Court each summer.
